The inspiring Youth Dance Platform follows, always a sell-out show, bringing together dance performances from all over Hampshire. New to our programe and the success of the recent visiting poets to Bedales, we will host our very own Poetry Festival showcasing the work of Bedalian poets alongside published poets. With the fantastic development of jazz at Bedales we welcome two events to the Summer term. Firstly, an opportunity to hear the 25 strong Bedales Jazz Band in an informal Jazz Café event in the Quad. Followed by a very special concert by two world renowned jazz musicians Jason Robello and Tim Garland, a night not to be missed. The Prep School feature highly this term with their ever-popular Rock Show and devised Block 2 (Year 8) Summer Play.

Getting here for your event



Orchard Building by taking the first right turn. On foot,

follow the road through to the right, away from the main reception until you see an impressive, timber-framed, pyramidal building: the Olivier Theatre. Go straight through reception in the Orchard Building and follow the red brick path for the Lupton Hall, at the end of the equally awe-inspiring arts and crafts Memorial Library. For The Quad, follow directions as for the Lupton Hall but keep walking through a set of oak double doors under a covered way. The Old Drama Studio is the oldest building on the site and is tucked behind the new Art and Design building. Our New Drama Studio, opposite the Olivier Theatre, opened in 2021 and is now being used for some performances. Finally, the new Assembly Hall, opened 2024 is situated next to the Olivier Theatre. Feel free to come to the Olivier Theatre for directions if anything is too hidden.
